## Rural Roads: An Endangered Species

TRIP, a national transportation research group, of which AED is a member, released a report detailing how the poor conditions of America's rural transportation infrastructure impact the country.

Although only 20 percent of Americans live in rural environments, nearly 60 percent of all automotive fatalities happen on roads in less populated areas. The report indicates that there are many opportunities for cost-effective improvements, such as wider shoulders and rumble-strips, which would significantly improve safety.
