



NY's Roads & Bridges Are Deficient & It's Costing Us

A new study from a DC-based transportation research group says many roads and bridges in New York state are deficient or sub-standard, and it's costing us.

The study from "TRIP" says bad roads cost New York motorists about \$25 billion per year, and about \$2 thousand annually here in the Capital District.

The study maintains that 38% of major state-maintained roads are in poor condition, and about 2/5th of New York's bridges are structurally deficient or functionally obsolete.....but nonetheless safe to drive over.

Traffic congestion is getting worse, with 42 hours of delay a year for the average motorist in Albany....with costs for lost time and fuel.
