



Pennsylvania's rural roads and bridges among the worst in the country

(Harrisburg, PA) - A national transportation research group rates Pennsylvania's rural roads and bridges among the worst in the country. A report released this week by TRIP ranks the Keystone State at number 13 for having the most deteriorated infrastructure. The report evaluated the condition of the bridges and their safety and found that 15-percent of rural bridges and about 18-percent of rural roads in the state are in poor condition. The report indicates that traffic deaths on the state's rural roads is about double the rate on all other roads.
