TRIP generated news media coverage for the [March 2026 report](#) included 10 independent media outlets, equaling 17 broadcasts from these outlets across multiple platforms. This does not include social media postings from news sources, policymakers, and stakeholders. These impressions reached 336,369 individuals with a media value of \$1,698,501, representing multiple regions across the state and more than one mention on a national SiriusXM radio show.
